NOW ACCEPTING APPLICATIONS FOR 2025!

Application Deadline July 15th!

As part of its charter, the Louisiana Gas Association sponsors various Public Education and Public Relations programs, including Scholarship awards to qualifying students attending 4-year accredited Colleges and Universities. More than \$258,000 in scholarships have been awarded since 1998.

UNDERGRADUATE CRITERIA:

- Must be a current full-time student attending an accredited 4-year college or university or a combination of a 4-year program at a college or university and specialty school (ie. Nursing school).
- Must have completed at least 60 credit hours (Junior or Senior classification).
- Must be 25 years old or younger at the time of application.
- Must be enrolled at the time of application submission.
- Must demonstrate well-roundedness through extracurricular activities, club memberships, community service, or leadership roles.

MASTER'S DEGREE CRITERIA: *NEW

- Must be currently enrolled in a Master's degree program at an accredited institution.
- Must provide evidence of academic excellence and leadership in their field.
- No age restriction applies to Master's applicants.

Honoring Louisiana's Fallen Firefighters: LGA Shows Support

On April 12, the Louisiana Gas Association (LGA) reaffirmed its commitment to honoring the bravery and sacrifice of Louisiana's firefighters. LGA President Larry Williams, 1st Vice President Nathan Gray, and Past President Robert Borne attended the Louisiana Fallen Firefighter Memorial service, paying tribute to the courageous men and women who have lost their lives in the line of duty.

This solemn event, held at the Louisiana Fallen Firefighters Memorial in Baton Rouge, brought together firefighters, families, and supporters from across the state. The ceremony serves as a powerful reminder of the dedication and heroism of those who put their lives on the line every day to protect our communities.

INDUSTRY SPOTLIGHT

Leak survey gas detection equipment plays a critical role in ensuring the safety, efficiency, and reliability of Atmos Energy's gas systems. We utilize the RMLD (Remote Methane Leak Detector), LZ-30 (Small handheld Laser Methane Detector), and AMLD (Advanced Mobile Leak Detector). All three instruments have significantly improved the process of natural gas leak detection compared to the Flame Ionization units of the past.

Atmos Energy Louisiana began using the RMLD unit in 2004. Since then, with updates to the unit, we are now able to utilize Bluetooth, GPS, and photo documentation. The RMLD is our primary leak detection equipment for conducting traditional leak surveys. The advantages of the RMLD include access to pipelines located in backyards, over or through fences, and sections of pipe attached to bridges or overpasses.

The LZ-30 is relatively new to our Louisiana team. This unit is used primarily by our Service Technicians for both inside and outside leak investigations. It is a small, handheld device, ideal for fire investigations and small leak surveys.

The AMLD has been a significant advancement in natural gas leak detection. This unit reads in single parts per billion (PPB) while sampling both methane and ethane gases. Because the unit is mounted on an automobile, it can cover a larger area than a standard traditional survey. However, due to its threshold and sensitivity, the soil conditions in Louisiana produce a substantial amount of swamp gases, which can result in false positives.

Overall, all three units have added tremendous value to leak detection, and we anticipate technology will continue to grow and advance in the future.
